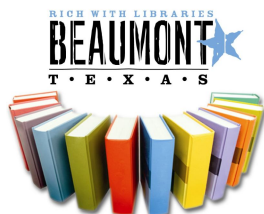

The Tyrrell Historical Library move continues to proceed smoothly . . .

The various historical collections at the Tyrrell Historical Library are being moved in a timely manner. The art book collection has been moved down to the first floor of the original library building to afford greater access to this collection. Likewise, the Texas biography, Texas authors of fiction, and Texana (Texas history) oversized book collections have been moved to the first floor of the original library building. All of these collections can be found where the genealogical book collection once was situated. It is hoped that these

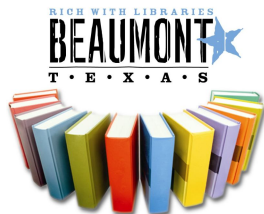
collections will be used more frequently by researchers. Also, the library's archival collections are presently being moved over to new moveable shelving units located on the second floor of the new library annex building. The compact storage units will allow for increased storage capacity for future growth and security of the archival collections.

During the whole move process the library has been kept open to allow the public access to the collections. The reading room has a fuller range of materials including Beaumont city newspapers, city directories, telephone directories, genealogical books, and microfilmed censuses and vital records. The public is encouraged to visit the library and explore further the genealogical sources that it has to offer.

The library is excited to welcome several new volunteers to the facility. Soon there will be some new faces to help you with your research when visiting the library. Anyone interested in volunteering at the Tyrrell Historical Library should speak with the branch manager, Bill Grace.
